BIO

Natalya Radünz (b. 1980, Ukraine) is a metamodern artist and iconographer based in Germany. Active since 2012, she studied Contemporary Art at the Sotheby's Institute of Art in London and holds degrees in engineering, an MBA, and a Harvard certification in strategy. Her practice merges traditional and modern techniques, exploring themes of transformation, spirituality, and cultural transition.

Influenced by Orthodox symbolism and philosophical concepts, Radünz works in oil, tempera, and mixed media. Her current series, Before the First Light and The Echoes of Infinity, investigate resonance as a space of truth beyond opposites.

Her works have been shown internationally—including museums and galleries in Italy, France, Germany, Greece, Serbia, Russia, USA —and are held in private collections across Europe. She has received over a dozen awards in painting and iconography.



ARTIST'S STATEMENT

I am an engineer of the soul, an artist of my life.

I work impulsively—my artworks emerge from the immediacy of the moment, guided by sensations, memories, and internal imagery that only take shape during the act of creation. I begin without a predetermined composition; the movement of the hand becomes the language of the subconscious. Through this process, my "Blind Paintings" have evolved—spontaneous compositions where intuition triumphs over calculation.

Craftsmanship is as essential to me as expressive freedom. I work with oil, acrylics, egg tempera, natural pigments, and 24-karat gold leaf, and I explore a range of mixed techniques to create surfaces that are both tactile and symbolically charged. Each material speaks its own language, and I switch between them to express multidimensionality.

My works typically range from medium formats—around 30 × 40 cm to 60 × 80 cm—but I also produce large-scale pieces up to 150 cm, offering immersive visual experiences.

My visual language explores themes such as transformation of consciousness, silent tension, spiritual reflection, and cultural in-betweenness. I delve into internal contradictions: pain becomes light, doubt turns into rhythmic line, stillness solidifies into form. I am not interested in gloss or perfection—but in the unsaid, the unseen vibrations beneath the surface. In my current series, I engage with René Descartes' philosophy of mind-body dualism, which serves as a conceptual foundation. Christian symbolism of the Holy Trinity and quantum principles—where micro and macro realms intersect—are woven into the imagery. Inspired by Marcel Duchamp's idea of "infrathin," I seek to capture transitional states—fleeting, barely perceptible thresholds—and render them as visual metaphors for time, awareness, and identity.

The influence of artists like Banksy and Duchamp accompanies my work—not in aesthetics, but in attitude. I take a stance, resist categorization, and rely on the power of the moment. I transform the system.

My works are intended for those who find themselves in in-between states—moments of helplessness, inner friction, or silent insight. I understand my work as an invitation to dialogue, not mere observation. I do not reproduce the world—I create spaces of experience that shift perception. Each painting is a new attempt to make the invisible visible—beyond convention, radically open, full of internal tension and contradiction.



The "She Could Fly" series















